- 2. PUBLIC DISCUSSION: The public is welcomed and encouraged to address the Board at this time on matters not on the Agenda. c. FIRE STATION UPDATES

This time is set aside for comment/discussion on matters relating to the acquisition of land, architectural designs, construction plans, building and landscaping maintenance, funding sources, and site suitability of current and future firehouses.

- i. The Board will consider identifying key people in the identification and acquisition of fire station site(s).
- ii. The Fire Chief will present a draft Request for Proposal to hire an architect for the remodel of the Geyserville Fire Station.

d. COUNTY TAX EXCHANGE AGREEMENT AUDIT

The Board will review and consider approving a Request for Proposal to engage an auditor/auditor firm to review current structure and payments.

e. PROPOSED SALES TAX MEASURE

Director Peterson will address the 5% of the sales tax that will go to county wide vegetation management and the draft framework for its administration with Fire Safe Sonoma and the District.

f. APPROVE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT POSITION

The Board will consider approving the position of Administrative Assistant and establishing the wages for the position.

g. FENCE REPAIR
